Remembering Rev. Shirley Ranck

It is with sadness CUUPS remembers Reverend Shirley Ranck in its Ancestral ranks. Shirley served on the CUUPS board and was a huge supporter of the organization. It was a joy to have her join us at Convocation in Salem, Massachusetts in 2015.

President Emeritus of CUUPS, Jerrie Hildebrand worked with Shirley on the book *Pagan and Earth-Centered Voices in Unitarian Universalism.* Jerrie and Shirley spent two and a half years working with essayists, editing, writing the extra material requested by the publisher, writing their own pieces, and learning a lot from one another.

Rev. Shirley Ann Ranck of Niles Michigan, passed away peacefully Sunday, May 14, 2023. She was born in Jersey City, NJ on October 22, 1930 to Gilbert Holmes and Ann West Bush. She grew up in a number of New Jersey suburbs of New York City.

Shirley received her BA degree from Montclair State University in 1953 followed by a Masters of Religious Education from Drew University in 1958, an MA in Clinical Psychology from City University of New York in 1964, a PhD in Urban School Psychology from Fordham University in 1976, and a Master of Divinity from the Thomas Starr King School for the Ministry in 1978. Shirley worked for many years as a school psychologist in the Livingston, NJ public schools. After receiving her PhD, she decided on a career change and became a Unitarian Universalist minister. Most of her career was spent as an interim minister for various Unitarian Universalist congregations around the United States and Canada.

Shirley is the author of the *Cakes for the Queen of Heaven: A Ten Session Course in Feminist Thealogy*, published by the Unitarian Universalist Association. She is also author of the books *Cakes for the Queen of Heaven* and *The Grandmother Galaxy*, and a number of articles for various publications. Her last published work was as coeditor and co-author of *Pagan and Earth-Centered Voices in Unitarian Universalism*.

Shirley is survived by her sons, Scott Page (Joy Chase) and James Page (Carole Briggs), both of Madison, WI and her daughters, Christina Ranck (Edward) Bell of Sonoma, California and Laura (Donald) Van Lue of Niles, Michigan;

News from the Chapter Coordinator

As the new Chapter Coordinator for CUUPS since January 1, I am happy to welcome three new chapters that have been approved during my tenure: Path of the Labyrinth in Rockledge, FL; First Parish CUUPS in Billerica, MA; and Ontario Shores Circle in Rochester, NY. Several other chapter applications are in process.

One of the most common questions I get as Chapter Coordinator is about chapter renewals. Since we don't have automated reminders for dates when annual renewals are due, we are asking that all chapters renew annually on

January 1 of each year. Annual dues are \$30 but are waived if there are five dues-paying members verified by CUUPS.

CUUPS has a new policy for chapter email addresses. We are requesting that each chapter develop a chapter email address tied to the congregation's email or, if that is not tenable, a Gmail address specific to the chapter rather than a personal email address. Doing so will help promote continuity in chapter communications and prevent email bounces when chapter contacts using their personal email addresses move on.

If you are part of a pagan group that is meeting at a UU congregation but has not yet become a chapter, we encourage you and your fellow pagans to consider becoming a chapter. The benefits are many: access to right-relations consulting for issues impacting relationships within the group as well as with the congregation; networking with other chapters and members throughout the world; participation in the larger UU and pagan communities; mutual benefit for chapters and congregations in sharing resources and providing support for each other's goals and projects; and many more!

I will be at the UU General Assembly in June and invite any of you who will also be attending to stop by the CUUPS booth to ask questions or just schmooze. We will have a new Chapter Handbook available for chapter coordinators free at the booth. It provides all the information you will need to start a chapter and deal with the many vicissitudes that may arise while operating as a chapter. If you're interested in forming a chapter, please let us know so that we may assist you.
